Program:

Past President Fred Grant introduced today's speaker, Cassandra McDonald.

Cassandra is a resident of Zanesville and is married to the Rev. Nathan McDonald. The McDonald's have five children, all with musical backgrounds; the first four having finished their college degrees with majors in music and the other following suit.

Cassandra attended Cass Technical High School in Detroit and then earned a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Michigan. She has also studied at Bowling Green University, Wayne State University and

the Interlocken National Summer Camp. Cassandra received her Masters of Arts in Education at Muskingum College and currently teaches voice there.

Cassandra's lively presentation emphasized her belief that music reflects and affects everything. Music affects everyone. Music defines cultures. Music defines an era. Cassandra believes that the one on one attention given to music students has a positive affect on them emotionally as well as educationally. These beliefs have led her to develop programs that integrate music into the teaching/learning curriculum to be used by all courses of study. Evolving out of these beliefs was C.A.S.S. Productions Inc. (Creating Artists Stimulating Success) a non-profit foundation of which Mrs. McDonald is founder and C.E.O.. C.A.S.S. Productions produces Mind Your Own Business (Making Impact Negotiating Decisions) a yearlong computer media center providing basic literacy and career exploration for young people and adults and C.A.S.S. Performing Arts Camp. C.A.S.S. camp is the fruition of a dream of Cassandra's to educate students from grades 7 through 12. C.A.S.S. camp is a weeklong summer program where children learn about music history, various genres of music, gospel, classical, and jazz, learn to read and interpret music, and compose their own music. There are nightly free concerts. College professors teach the students. The students are exposed to real Grammy award winning performers and a music production. C.A.S.S. Camp is now in its fourth consecutive year.
