## PROGRAM

Janet Stewart introduced Bill Bussey, Superintendent of Mid-East Career and Technology Centers.

Bill updated the members concerning how the funds would be used that were generated by the May levy victory. Since the levy would raise over \$10 million, the state would provide approximately \$22.7 million for construction.

The monies will allow the following renovations to occur:

- Update technology
- Replace/upgrade plumbing, heating and electrical systems
- Bring facilities to OSFC's building standards/codes
- Meet today's educational requirements
- Additional classroom space
- Potential new programs

Additional funds may be raised through the sale of bonds. This would access about \$6 million dollars so the project could be done all at once. Bill hoped the entire renovation could be completed in 2-3 years.
