PROGRAM

Mike Alfman introduced Bill Huston, Muskingum County Executive Director of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Bill farms 200 acres of his own but spoke about his 13 month duty in Iraq as part of an agricultural reconstruction team. He was sent to an area north of Baghdad called the Diyala Province, whose main industry is agriculture, primarily dates grown in large Date Palm groves. It is also recog-

nized as the orange capital of the Middle East. The farmers grow many other vegetable such as olives, egg plant, okra, pomegranates, cucumbers, and tomatoes. Their diet also includes lots of poultry, lamb, cheese and bread.

Bill said the main objective of his team was to set-up an organized farm group and move away from Saddam Hussein's Soviet style agriculture. For example, Bill's team worked with the government to allow more intensive application of urea to the soil. The government agreed as long as the urea was immediately spread on the fields and not stored for possible use as an explosive. The team motto was "Overall do no harm".
