Dr. Paul will pay a dollar for his Wii bowling episode highly publicized on WHIZ recently. After a brief review of last week's Oscar Awards including a few more fines, he introduced the day's speaker, Barb Shelby.

GUEST SPEAKER

Barb Shelby has served at Zane State College for 13 years. Currently, she is the Dean of Education and Behavioral Health Sciences. She is responsible for day to day operations of Allied Health which includes 10 programs. Barb is also working on her PhD in physical therapy after receiving her Bachelor's degree from Ashland and her Master's degree from Ohio State.

Barb gave a wealth of information about what is happening at Zane State. She kept the audience engaged by giving us pop quizzes that we could answer with an electronic clicker. Results of our answers were immediately available on the screen within her presentation. Some notable facts about Zane State College include: 75% of students live within 30 miles; ZSC is 50% less expensive than public 4-year colleges at \$85/credit hour and credits easily transfer; ZSC's enrollment growth has increased 63% in the last 6 years; and ZSC was ranked 9th in the US for 2-year educational institutions.

Zane State focuses on Students – 2876 of them with an average age of 28 years. Most common areas of study are health, business, engineering, natural science & math, and social and behavioral sciences; Partnerships – many partnerships with other educational centers, business and industry; and, Community – many non-credit educational opportunities are available to the community such as kids in the kitchen, dog obedience, yoga, holiday cooking, and alternative therapy and relaxation.

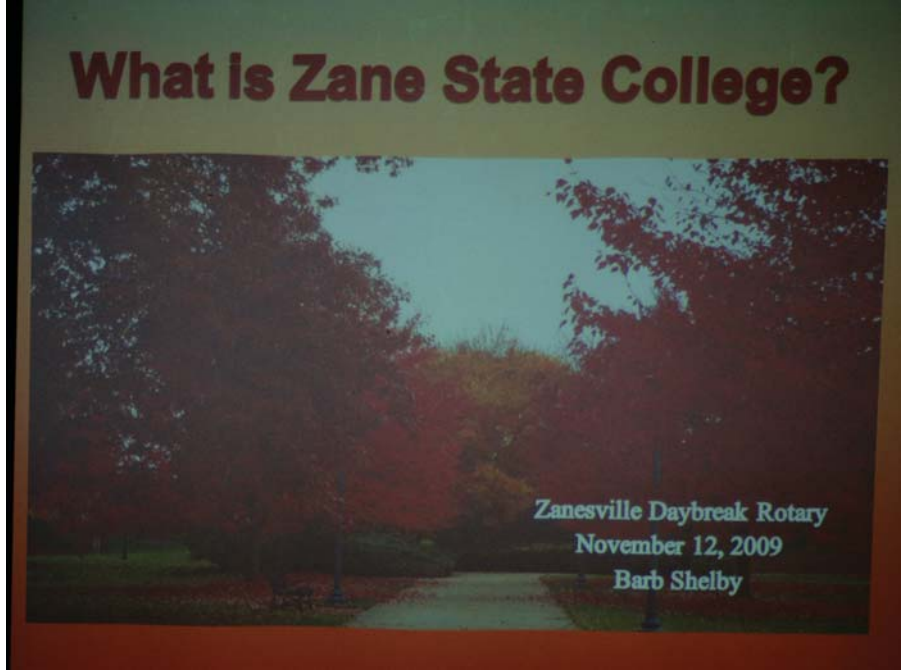
Zane State is Learner-centered. Hands on learning is offered at ZSC – for example a shooting

range, occupational therapy measuring range of motion, welding, culinary lab, mechanical engineering. The foundation of ZSC is Personal Touch – Respect, Responsibility, and Responsiveness.
