## FOUR WAY TEST

Sarge Paul yielded his time today to our speaker, Elden Hudson who was introduced by Past President Fred Grant. Elden was born in Coshocton and graduated from Coshocton High School. He married his high school sweetheart, Carole and they have three children. Elden is a Navy Veteran from WWII and he retired from Ohio Power in 1989 after 42 years of service. His work with Ohio Power required him to move several times during his tenure. He lived in Canton, Denison, Minerva, Bucyrus, Lima and Zanesville over the years. Elden has been a Rotarian for 54 years. He has had 53 years of perfect attendance. Elden's presentation is on the Four Way Test.

In 1966, the Bucyrus Rotary Club asked Elden to present on the Four Way Test. Elden studied the Four Way Test and prepared a presentation that he has since shared with several clubs. The Four Way Test is the centerpiece of Rotary. It is the heart of vocational service. Herbert J. Taylor, a Chicago Rotarian was the creator of the Four Way Test. In 1954 he was the Rotary International president, during the 50th anniversary year. Herbert was from a small town where his father was a multi-businessman. Herbert studied at Northwestern University while holding four jobs. After graduation, he moved to Oklahoma where he organized a Rotary Club. About 10 years later he moved to Chicago and joined a Rotary Club. He and his wife established a mission and started a youth organization. During Herbert's business life he wished for a simple measuring stick to help him, and others, know what was the right thing to do. Since Herbert was a religious man he prayed about it. In 1932, while he was praying, a message came to him and he wrote it down on a card. He tucked it away for awhile so he could test it out. After a couple of months, Herbert decided to share the Test with four Department heads in his business who were from different religious backgrounds. They all agreed that the Test was not in conflict with their religious beliefs and there was no conflict with truth, justice, friendliness, and helpfulness. They agreed to try the Test in their business lives. In a short time, the business, which had been struggling, began to

turn around. This turnaround was attributed to the Four Way Test.

Herbert continued to live by the Four Way Test and in 1954, he presented Rotary with the copyright to it. Herbert lived to age 85.

*“Of all the things we think, say, and do. . .  
Is it the truth?  
Is it fair to all concerned?  
Will it build good will and better friendships?  
Will it be beneficial to all concerned?”*

This Four Way Test is the standard of behavior for all Rotarians.
