## PROGRAM

\*\*\*Today's meeting took place at COLL MATERIALS, 4005 All American Way. Renee Coll, owner and Vice President of Sales shared information and led us in a tour of the facility. Renee and her husband both saw an opportunity for this type of business to thrive in today's economy, and have slowly expanded to where they are today.

Renee explained various reasons that we should recycle, including benefits to the environment, not filling our landfills; creating new jobs associated

to recycling; saving our natural resources, and numerous other benefits. Companies that purchase recycled products can save approximately fifty percent in cost of goods sold.

Currently the company employs approximately 40 employees and will be adding positions as they expand with additional equipment used in day to day operations. Due to freight costs Zanesville is considered a beneficial location with Interstate 70 and Interstate 71. For additional growth another facility would have to be located west of the Mississippi River to be competitive with freight costs incurred from greater distance.

With 40 employees, the company runs three shifts, five days a week. They recycle post-industrial and post-consumer products. Products recycled include paper, plastic, metal, glass, and automotive by-products.

They are currently celebrating their second anniversary. We are very fortunate to have this growing company providing jobs in our community.
