Anna, who reminded our club that The Carr Center has been in existence since 1956, talked about the many programs offered, including Speech Therapy, Adult Daycare, Safety Town, and Special Riders. Many of the programs are directed towards

children and provide early intervention for children ages 18 months to 5 years old.

Several support groups are also available at The Carr Center, including an Arthritis Support Group, Parents of Children with Special Needs, and special support is provided for parents needing car seats for children.

Annually, The Carr Center awards a \$1,000 scholarship to a Muskingum County college bound student with a physical or sensory disability.

Anna reminded us that the Annual Cake Auction is scheduled for April 22 and 23 at the Colony Square Mall. Cake entries are still being accepted until April 15. Mary Ann Bucci will be providing a special flameless candle for the event. This very important event provides 20-25% of the operating budget for The Carr Center and requires many volunteers to make it successful.
