She spent much of her youth in Eufurt, Germany, the daughter of a railroad official and teacher/musician. The family also lived in Berlin and went through very difficult times during the war, and like many in Europe, struggled for food and suitable accommodations. After the war Brigette also spent time in London and Paris, car-

ing for children and teaching.

Brigette met her husband in Europe, through a mutual friend, and was married six months later. She and her husband originally located in New Concord and he taught at Grover Cleveland Junior High School. Later, while they raised two children, her husband taught in several schools and universities throughout the United States. Bridgette worked in several vocations, including travel agency, teaching, accounting and medical transcription.

After spending enjoyable time in Savannah, Georgia, her husband accepted a teaching position in Germany and Brigette welcomed the opportunity to visit family and friends again in Europe, before later returning to the United States.

Brigette also shared her perspective on how fortunate we are to be living in America and having the guidance and wisdom of our forefathers. Although not perfect, democracy does give us freedom to choose our elected officials and empower them to represent the people who elect them.

Thank you, Brigette, for a very enjoyable and entertaining vocational talk. Learning more about our fellow Rotarians is always one of our best programs.
