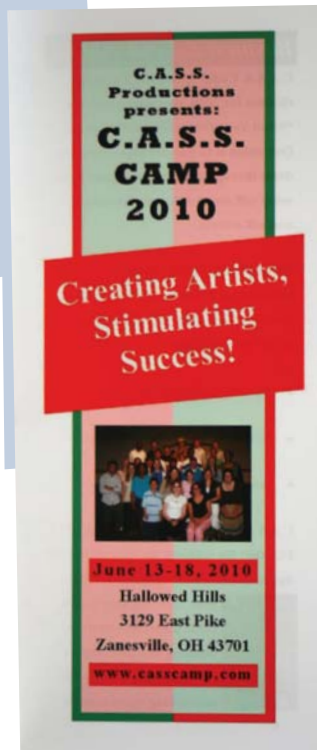
## SERGEANT AT ARMS:
