PROGRAM:

Colleen Romito of United Way for Muskingum, Perry and Morgan Counties presented the program. Colleen related how her own childhood experiences influenced her desire to work in the community service area. Due to her mother's illness, the family was sometimes divided, and she felt positive mentoring by a counselor through a Community Youth Program helped her to succeed in school.

She explained how the UW held a number of community meetings to examine the needs of the area with the focus on education and healthcare. One of the outcomes of this study was the Emergency Aide "211" service. Those in need may call this number to find the resources in our community available to them. After tracking the calls, it was discovered that many are for food, utilities, and healthcare. Clients can then be referred to organizations that might help them.

Among the many services available, the UW is helping to break the circle of poverty by offering Family Financial Stability Partnerships which includes financial literacy and free tax preparation.

UW encourages volunteerism by youth and adults in the community and "collective action" by individuals, businesses, and organizations. Last year over \$925,000 was collected and distributed to some 14 organizations including YMCA, Zanesville Day Nursery, Scouting, and Eastside among others.

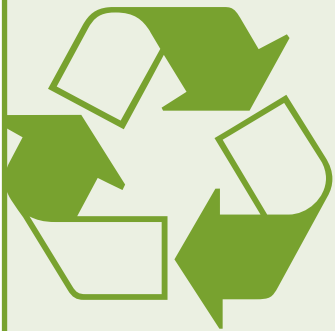

Cleveland welcomes the Great Lakes United Tall Ships Challenge ®, a series of port to port international sailing races, cruises and maritime festivals starting in Toronto and ending in Chicago.
