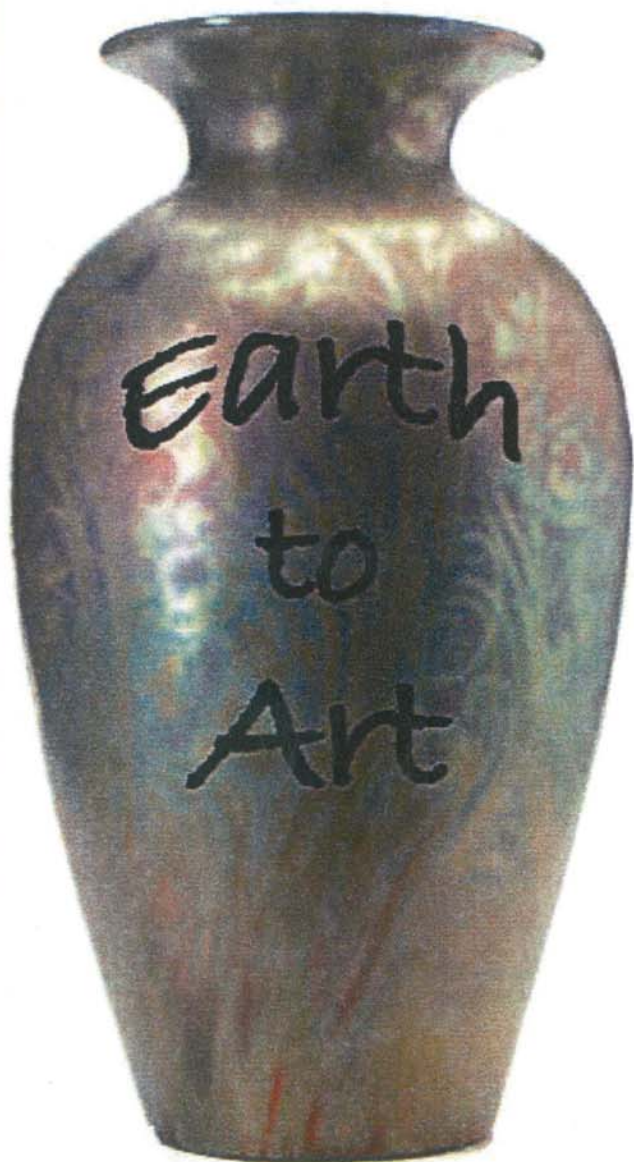

**About the Festival:** In July 2010 a fleet of magnificent Tall Ships will sail into the Port of Cleveland to participate in a 4-day, fun-filled festival. The Rotary Club of Cleveland will host 9 -11 replica historic vessels in celebration of its 100th anniversary in honor of its long-time commitment to the people of the City of Cleveland. The Festival will showcase the diverse Great Lakes maritime history, spotlighting environmental themes while promoting youth leadership through sail training. Visitors can board the vessels, meet the crew and experience the heritage these ships symbolize. Cleveland welcomes the Great Lakes United Tall Ships Challenge®, a series of port to port international sailing races, cruises and maritime festivals starting in Toronto and ending in Chicago.

Majestic Parade of Sail: 4:00 p.m.  
Opening Ceremonies: 7:00 p.m.

The public is invited to view the spectacular entry of the Tall Ships under full sail into Cleveland’s harbor. Ships will not be open for boarding after the Parade. Final viewing location will be available at a later date. Ships will then be docked downtown at the Port of Cleveland. Opening festivities will follow the Parade of Sail.
