PROGRAM:

Vickie Kumorowski introduced Doctor Stuart Chow from the Genesis Trauma Unit. Dr. Chow brings with him a great deal of experience not only as a practicing physician, but also 12 years of trauma experience. Forty percent of all deaths are caused by some type of trauma. Some of the most frequent traumas are motorcycle and car accidents, falls, gunshot wounds, and fire related accidents. Trauma units are charged with the responsibility of treating the patient's injury, as well as, their recovery time. Trauma units range from level 1 to level 4, one being the highest and 4 the lowest. Level 1 requires a great deal of resources to maintain. Level 1 units have equipment standards, doctor availability standards and a minimum volume of patient visits into the trauma unit.

Genesis is in the process of being certified as a level 3 trauma unit. House Bill 138 was passed to try and set standards in the trauma units. It is very difficult to become certified as a trauma unit at any level. The process is lengthy and very regimental. Genesis requested an evaluation for their trauma unit back in February of this year and will finally get evaluated starting next week on the 14th and 15th. The Ohio Dept. of Health will be in to evaluate their current progress. They will scrutinize every facet of the trauma unit to

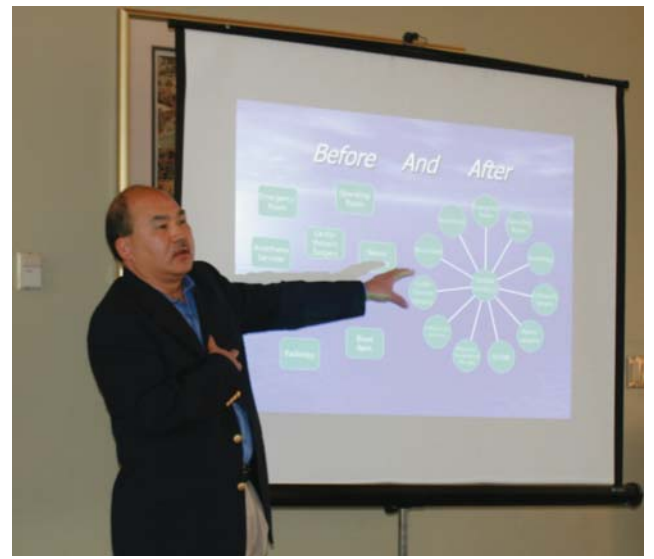

make sure that it has a very cohesive flow from department to department. Once they have completed their evaluation and the report is completed, Genesis will be asked to address any areas of non-compliance. The Ohio Dept. of Health will schedule a follow up evaluation. Dr. Chow was hopeful that they would be able to pass the second evaluation and become a certified Level 3 Trauma Unit. Our community wishes them much success. If the process goes according to plans the trauma unit could be certified and open for business by September 1, 2010.
